This session helps students understand what respect is and why it is important, with a particular focus on the importance of respecting differences.		EYFS/KS1 students who are beginning to understand concepts such as kindness.

Timing	Activity	Aim(s) and link(s)
0-5	Explain that this week is Anti-Bullying Week – explain what this is and why we have it. It is important that children understand the difference between bullying and other behaviours.	To explain what bullying is and why we have Anti-Bullying Week.
5-15	<p>What is respect?</p> <p>Ask pupils to work with partners to think about what respect means. Take their feedback, you may want to add it</p>	For students to understand what respect is.

	<p>to the slide in a mindmap.</p> <p>Ideas might include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Being OK with everyone being different - Being kind - Caring about how people feel - Listening to people <p>How might someone be different to you?</p> <p>Ideas might include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How they look - What they wear - Different religions - Different genders - Different families - Different interests <p>You may want to bring attention to the fact that no two people are the same - you could use teachers as an example.</p>	<p>For students to think about how people may be different from one another.</p>
15-20	<p>How can we show respect? Pupils talk to their partners. It may be useful to think about this in particular situations e.g. how do we show respect in the classroom/playground.</p> <p>Explain that it is important that we respect everyone's differences and that no one should be bullied because they are different.</p> <p>Make the link back to your school and how you respect differences. You may want to reference specific events/rules that showcase these.</p>	<p>To understand why respecting differences is so important and particularly how they can show respect.</p>
