'Two Songs for Heidli Anderson'


W. H. Auden

From Prejudice to Pride


Amy Lamé


'Martha' *Audre Lorde* 

Suitable for: KS4, KS5

This poem is considered to be Lorde's first public "coming out" as a lesbian. In it Lorde speaks to Martha, a woman she loves, who was sent to an asylum for Electroconvulsive Therapy (ECT).







Will Grayson, Will Grayson


John Green and David Levithan

A collaboration between two authors, this novel follows the stories of two boys named Will Grayson. Odd-numbered chapters tell the story of a heterosexual teenager, and even-numbered chapters of the second Will Grayson, a gay teenager.







Oranges Are Not The Only Fruit


Jeanette Winterson

A coming-of-age story about Jeanette, a girl growing up in an English Pentecostal community who finds herself attracted to another girl. The novel follows her relationships with women, and her efforts to reconcile her sexuality the Church and belief in God.








Love Simon: Simon Vs The Homo Sapiens Agenda Becky Albertalli


Leah on the Offbeat Becky Albertalli

Every Day


David Levithan


Lies We Tell Ourselves

In the tradition of The Arabian Nights, a beautifully illustrated tapestry of folk tales and myths about the secret legacy of female storytellers in an imagined medieval world.








More Than This Patrick Ness

Themes: trauma, identity, empathy, the past


Aristotle and Dante Discover the Secrets of the Universe Benjamin Alire Sáenz


Release Patrick Ness


The Miseducation of Cameron Post Emily Danforth


Not Your Sidekick C. B. Lee


Boy Meets Boy David Levithan

Suitable for: KS3, KS4


More Happy Than Not Adam Silvera

Suitable for: KS3, KS4

Themes: identity, sexuality, family, secrecy

The last thing in the world Thom Creed wants is to add to his father's pain, so he keeps secrets. Like that he has special powers. And that he's been asked to join the League. But the most painful secret of all is one Thom can barely face himself: he's gay.







'Hour'
Carol Ann Duffy

Suitable for: KS3, KS4

Themes: romantic love, gender, time

Carol Ann Duffy's narrator speaks to their partner about the preciousness of a moment with someone you love. Neither the gender of the narrator or the partner is specified.








'Goblin Market'
Christina Rossetti

Suitable for: KS4, KS5

Themes: female friendship, loyalty, sexuality

Although on the face of it a poem about 'sisterly love', readers have continued to find LGBT+ readings through its description of female sexuality and it remains a hugely iconic poem.







'Sonnet 20'
William Shakespeare

Suitable for: KS4, KS5

Themes: gender, adoration, beauty

'Sonnet 20' calls out for analysis and interpretation, but ultimately some aspects of it will always elude any attempts to offer up a clear and straightforward reading. However, its message is plain: Shakespeare is clearly besotted with the Fair Youth.
